Date: Friday, Midnight 12th July – Tuesday, Morning 16th July.

Destinations: Ise (Mie Prefecture), Kumano (Nachi Shrine, Hayatama Shrine, and Hongu Shrine) and Koyasan (Wakayama Prefecture)

Transportation: Chartered Bus

Travel expenses: 20,000 yen (includes 2 nights at inns, museum admission fees, travel insurance, etc.)

Conditions:

- This field trip is open for the students enrolled in Todai (of course exchange students or other international students are eligible to apply).
 - Participants will be required to prepare for the destinations in advance.
- After this trip participants must submit results (essays, etc.).
