# Policies for the A Semester

### To: Faculty, Students, and Staff

Graduate School of Arts and Sciences / College of Arts and Sciences

After having conducted all of our classes online during the S Semester, we have decided to hold some A Semester classes in person. As part of our continuing effort to keep you up to date about the status of the Komaba Campus, I would like to inform you of our current policies, especially regarding the resumption of in-person classes.

Please continue to take measures to prevent the spread of infection, such as by avoiding the "3 C's" (closed spaces, crowds, and close contact), while on the Komaba Campus.

### **Policies Regarding Classes (Lectures, Exercises, and Practicums)**

Most classes will be conducted online in the A Semester. However, some classes in the following subjects will be taught in person or through a hybrid of in-person and online:

• Junior Division

Laboratory science, sports and fitness, foreign languages (other than English), and some integrated and thematic courses

• Senior Division and Graduate School

Some courses for which in-person teaching is regarded as necessary.

The number of students in a classroom must be small enough to allow each student to have an empty seat on both sides and in front and back.

### **Entrance to Campus**

Faculty and students may conduct and participate in online classes on campus if they have an in-person class before or after the online class or if they have trouble connecting to the Internet from home. Before entering campus, all people must first make a reservation at the following site:

Students may receive permission to enter campus by applying through the above site provided they have a satisfactory reason. Such reasons include: taking classes, conducting research, using the Library or Information Education Building, participating in extracurricular activities for which they have received permission from the Student Support Section, visiting the Academic Guidance Center, and having certificates issued or carrying out other academic procedures.

Entrance to campus is allowed only through the Main Gate. People who are not affiliated with the university are not, as a rule, allowed on campus without permission from the Dean's Office.
