- ① 1st-4th year undergraduate students (including PEAK students) of the College of Arts and Sciences, as well as students of the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences are now eligible!
- ② Students pay only 10,000 yen per exam.
- ③ Separate sign-up period for each of the 4 testing dates.

What is IELTS?

IELTS, along with TOEFL, is approved world-wide as an exam to measure English proficiency. Universities in Europe (including the U.K.), Australia, U.S.A., and Canada accept IELTS scores for study-abroad.

5 Advantages of taking the IELTS through the university this year

Group Application Requirements

Eligible Students: UTokyo students in the College of Arts and Sciences (1st~4th years, including PEAK students) as well as graduate students in the School of Arts and Sciences

Registration Period : A separate call for registration for the 4 exam dates

Number of Applicants : 500 students total (the allotment is listed below)

The method of registration will be announced at the information session

Qualifications : Students must agree to the following conditions:

- (1) The IELTS exam must be taken at the assigned venue on the reserved day.
- (2) 10,000 yen of the total cost of the IELTS exam (25,380 yen) must be paid by the student, and UTokyo will subsidize the remaining 15,380 yen.
- (3) Passports are necessary as a form of identification for the IELTS exam. Passports will be required to register and must be valid and presented on the day of the exam. Those needing to obtain a passport must do so at their own expense.
- (4) Choose the "Academic" module when registering.
- (5) Students must pay the fee to change the testing date more than two times. Changes within 5 weeks before the exam will not be allowed.
- (6) Students must pay for their own transportation to the testing center.
- (7) Students may request more than one copy of the test report form for an administrative fee of 1,100 yen per copy.
- (8) In taking the subsidized IELTS exam through the University, you agree to allow the Centre for Global Communication Strategies to use your scores as data for educational or teaching purposes.
- (9) If you register for an exam but do not take it, then you will be required to return the subsidized fee to the University.
