As you know, the number of people infected with COVID-19 is now increasing rapidly throughout Japan and especially in the Tokyo area. The number of new cases among UTokyo students, faculty, and staff has also been rising, and we must now strengthen our measures to prevent the further spread of infections.

As you have been told many times, infections spread easily when groups of people eat and drink together in confined spaces. Travel can also spread the virus, especially when people stay together overnight. We therefore urge you to continue to be very cautious about both meals and travel. We also once again ask you to continue to disinfect your hands, wear a mask, and maintain social distancing.

Thanks to the efforts of many people, UTokyo is now able to provide vaccinations on the Hongo Campus and can accept more reservations than previously. While vaccinations are not required of students, we urge you to take this opportunity to get vaccinated.

The current university-wide activity restriction level is Level B. Accordingly, the Komaba Campus remains at Stage Orange I. As long as our campus stays at this stage, we do not plan to impose stronger restrictions on student activities on campus.

On the condition that we continue to take thorough measures against the spread of infections, the College and Graduate School of Arts and Sciences and the Graduate School of Mathematical Sciences are now planning to make improvements to our campus so that students can use its facilities with even more confidence in their safety. We particularly want to create spaces where students can relax and talk with each other while

still maintaining social distancing. It is difficult for the faculty and staff to plan such spaces appropriately without input from students, however, so we would like to ask for your ideas and suggestions.
