Caution: Rules for Online Classes

To Students,

As a measure to prevent the spread of the new coronavirus infectious disease COVID -19, the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, College of Arts and Sciences offer online classes from the academic year of 2020. We announced the rules for attending online classes prior to implementation, but unfortunately the class images were found being uploaded to SNS and there have been several reports of cases considered as violations of rules.

In order not to repeat these actions, please check the following rules again.

It is forbidden to disclose Online URL Zoom links, video, image, sound that are recorded in the class, or materials and data provided in the class (slides, participant list, chat contents, etc.) to a third party or to upload them online for third parties to watch. (However, you may send the link to your classmate, if the UTAS server is down etc. for some unavoidable reason, and your classmate needs that information to participate in the class.) Failure to comply with these rules will be deemed academic misconduct as cheating. If you are considered to have engaged in academic misconduct, the grades of all the courses taken during the Semester including both two Terms in which the course is offered will be nullified, with no make-up exams permitted. If you violate any copyright laws, legal measures may be taken against you.

Please understand the aforementioned rules and be careful to avoid acts such as downloading and sharing. Do not consider this as a simple matter. The graduate school and the college will take a firm stand to violators of rules, and violators will be dealt with accordingly.
