		conduct research on a topic and write an argumentative essay using proper
		scholarly apparatus. Half-semester FLOW courses are designed to enhance
		fluency in academic discussion. The average class size is 15 students. The
		curriculum of the ALESS and ALESA Programs is under constant
		refinement through collaboration among all faculty.
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
