

Guideline for Course Registration of Specialized Courses

1. Check the courses that you can register as Specialized Courses (Senmon-kamoku) from the “List of Specialized Courses”.

2. Check the syllabus on UT-mate (Not UTask-Web).

3. Click “Syllabuses”-“View Syllabuses” and search by the following methods.

①Search by course code

Course codes are on the “List of Specialized Courses.” Enter the course code and click “Display syllabus” to view the syllabus.

②Search by other searching parameters

Select the following Faculty.
Faculty/Graduate school offering course: Select "Faculty of Arts and Sciences"
Then, click "Begin search."
You can limit the courses by selecting "Day of week" and "Period" parameter.

4. Register the courses on UTask-Web for the Specialized Courses. UT-mate is just to view the syllabus information. Make sure to check the “List of Specialized Courses” for the UTask-Web Course Code.

For some courses, you need permission from the Program Director of the JEA or ES. The specific information will be announced at the S Semester Guidance on April 3 (Fri).
