

Introduction of Long-Term Study System

Starting in the Academic Year 2016-2017, the College of Arts and Sciences has introduced a "Long-Term Study System". This system enables students fulfilling certain conditions to extend the duration of their study in the Junior Division from the standard period of two years to a maximum of four years, allowing them to systematically plan the courses they take over this extended period. Those students whose application to extend the period of study has been approved shall pay as tuition fees the same amount as the tuition fees for the standard period of study (two years) over the approved extended period of study.

Eligibility and application procedures are as follows.

1. Eligibility

Those to whom both of the following two conditions apply:

- (1) Students with disabilities (including visual or hearing impairments and limited mobility) who are judged to require more than the usual number of years to complete their course of study.
- (2) Students who are newly enrolled or current students who have been enrolled in the College for less than one year (excluding leaves of absence)

2. Start of Long-Term Study

From September only

3. Application Procedure

Those who wish to apply for an extension of the study period should contact by email or in person the PEAK/GPEAK Section, Academic Affairs Division, College of Arts and Sciences during the period specified below. When contacting the PEAK/GPEAK Section, please show your "Certificate of Admission".

Application period: Thu. 1st September 2016 to Thu. 15th September 2016

The PEAK/GPEAK Section will discuss with the applicants the conditions of their disabilities and their requests concerning their study, and will provide advice on the course registration plans and other matters relating to the preparation of the application documents.

4. Approval

The University will deliberate on whether or not to grant the approval for the extension of the study period on the basis of the conditions of the students' disabilities/progress of their rehabilitation and their course registration plan. The students will be notified of the results of the deliberations in late September.
