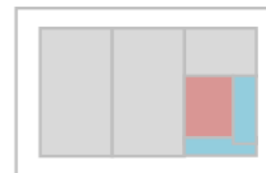


How to read the Grade Report for the Third Semester**(1) Required Credits / Credits Gained / Further Credits Required**

“Required Credits” : Requirements for Advancing to the Fourth Semester
(Please refer to PEAK Academic Handbook)

- ※ If you do not fulfill the requirements for advancing to the fourth semester at the end of the third semester, you will be automatically required to repeat beginning from the second semester of the first year of study (Remedial year (*Kō-nen*)).

“Credits Gained”: The credits you have gained by the end of the third semester

- ※ The credits for courses, except for Foreign Language courses, that you have passed by the overall point average are not included. Those credits will be included at the end of the fourth semester.

“Further Credits Required”: The credits required to gain for advancing to the fourth semester. These are shown only when you do not have enough credits for the requirements above.

- ※ “Further Credits Required” for foreign language courses are not shown even though you do not pass foreign language courses, since the requirements for advancing to the fourth semester for foreign language courses is a point average 40 or higher.

(2) Simple Average and Percentage Point Average for Each Course Group

For your reference, Simple Average is calculated based on the credits in the following table in the Grade Report.

- *1 For Group IV students (students assigned to Group IV for Japanese Language course), credits for alternative courses (courses which Group IV students must take to meet the Japanese language requirements) should be excluded from the actual “credits with the highest point.” For the detail, refer to the sample below.

Group IV Students

- *2 The points of courses whose credits you have gained more than the credits in the table above, are excluded from calculation of Simple Average.
- *3 Up to 6 credits for April-entry students' courses may be included in "16 credits with the highest point."
- *4 Up to 4 credits for Integrated Courses with the phrase "Topics in" may be included, limited to 2 credits per course group, in "16 credits with the highest point."
- *5 Up to 2 credits in total for "Sports and Fitness Exercise", and "Sports and Fitness Exercise II" (Group D: Human Beings and the Environment) may be included in "16 credits with the highest point."
- *6 "*" appears on the left of the course name that is used for calculation of Simple Average.

In the Grade Report, the percentage point average of course groups "required English Language," "required Japanese Language," "Information/Information Sciences," "Social Sciences, Humanities," "Mathematical Science, Material and Life Sciences," "Physical Education and Health Sciences," and "Integrated Courses" are shown for your reference.

The requirements for HS III students to advance to the fourth semester are fulfilled:
- 2 credits obtained for Introductory Seminar A

For students assigned to Group IV, the credits for alternative courses should be excluded from the "credits with the highest point" in the Grade Report; however, they may be included due to the current system's function. This means that Percentage Point Averages shown in this report may be different from the actual ones. If you would like to know the actual point averages, please visit the PEAK/GPEAK Section (Counter No. 2).

Up to 6 credits for April-entry student's Integrated Courses are counted in this cell; however, they are not shown in the rows from "Group A" to "Group F."

These are calculated based on the table on page 56 on "PEAK Academic Handbook." For Group IV students of HSIII, the number of the credits shown in this cell is "58," since they take 8 credits of alternative courses instead of required Japanese language courses. However, the total credits for calculation of Simple Average for HSIII Students should be 66. This means that Simple Average shown in this report may be different from the actual one. Only for foreign languages, "Further Credits Required" are not shown even though the point average of a language course group is below 40. In this case, the requirements for advancing to the fourth semester are not fulfilled since the point average is below 40.

The requirements for NS II students to advance to the fourth semester are fulfilled:
- 2 credits obtained for Introductory Seminar A

This student has gained 6 credits out of 8 credits for Social Sciences and Humanities Courses that are used for calculation of Simple Average. For the rest of 2 credits, "0" point if not fulfilled the required credits or points of failed Social Sciences and/or Humanities Course are used for the calculation of Simple Average.

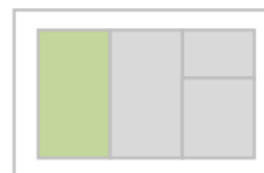
At the end of the third semester, except for foreign languages, the gained credits, excluding the ones for the courses the student has passed by "overall point average," are shown. At the end of fourth semester, all the credits for the courses the student has passed will be shown.

These are calculated based on the table on page 56 on "PEAK Academic Handbook." For Group IV students of NSII, the number of the credits shown in this cell is "62," since they take 6 credits of alternative courses instead of required Japanese language courses. However, the total credits for calculation of Simple Average for NSII Students should be 68. This means that Simple Average shown in this report may be different from the actual one. If you would like to know the actual Simple Average, please visit the PEAK/GPEAK Section.

For Group IV students, credits for English (elective) and Japanese (elective) are counted in the rows from "Others" to "Total;" however, they are not used for calculation of Simple Average.

For the following courses, pass/fail by the overall point average at the moment is shown:

If passing by overall point average, all the gained credits and the overall grade (A,B or C) for the course group are shown. If failing, further credit required and points required to pass by overall point average are shown.

Even though the overall point average for a language course group is more than a 50 at the end of the third semester, if you have received any "F" or "absent" in the third semester, you have to take "Fourth Semester Special Classes (Tokush kurasu)." In this case, the student has received an overall point average of B for the Japanese Language Course group; however, the student has not passed the course group by overall point average since the student has received an F in the third semester.

If the student has failed a course by overall point average, the further required credits and points required to pass by overall point average are shown. In this case, 15 more points will be needed to reach 100 points to pass the courses by overall point average.

For the courses that determine pass/fail by overall point average, the credits for each course are not shown.
