

Application for Ethical Review Related to Classes

If you are considering applying for an ethics review related to a university course, such as research using questionnaires or interviews in a university course, or conducting an exercise experiment or practice that may cause significant physical strain, please confirm the following principles in advance.

- The Committee will not make decisions regarding course content. If necessary, please consult with the responsible subcommittee for offering classes or the Academic Affairs Section.
- When filming or recording classes, consult with the Academic Affairs Section in advance, as there are other stipulations.
- The following actions should be taken after class, not during class time, to avoid infringing on the students' right to attend class.
 - To advertise or explain research
 - Obtaining consent for research.
 - Conducting research questionnaires and interviews.
 - Doing anything else related to the research.
- Clearly explain in advance that consent to participate in the research will not affect the credits or points earned.

In addition, please note the following points when preparing an application for research ethics review.

- Clearly separate the education from the research.
- Clearly state that the student must consent to participate in the research.
- The research plan should take into consideration the burden on students who agree to participate in the research.
- Clearly state any rights and obligations that may arise for students who agree to participate in the research.
- In the case of research that involves the publication of individual student results and efforts in the classroom, consent for publication should also be obtained. In the case of publication, measures should be taken to ensure that individuals cannot be identified.
- In the case of starting research using the results and initiatives of students (excluding research using only aggregate data) after a series of classes have been completed, and if the results and initiatives of individual students are to be made public, an explanation must be given to the individual students and their consent obtained.
