A cursory glance at the mission statements, visions and webpages of universities across the world shows that internationalisation is an increasingly important and shared objective. However, the promotion of a successful internationalization strategy presents various challenges for all members of the university from academic to support staff, home to international students, and across a range of activities including shaping the curriculum and enhancing the student experience.
